The Six Mistakes of Man

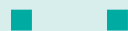
1. The delusion that individual advancement is made by crushing others.

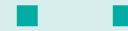
Pictured above is a copy of this month's parchment we print for our friends. It is 8.5x11 and free for you to pick up during your next visit.

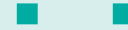

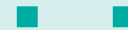

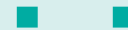
